Prices for whole egg and yolks were unchanged to higher, and whites were unchanged. The market tone was mostly steady to fully steady. Demand was generally improved and was fair to instances fairly good, best where buyer inventories had become depleted. Floor stocks were adequate. Shell egg costs were unchanged to higher. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection for the week ending July 13, 1996 in the Eastern region were 25% more than last week, and 7% more than the same week last year.

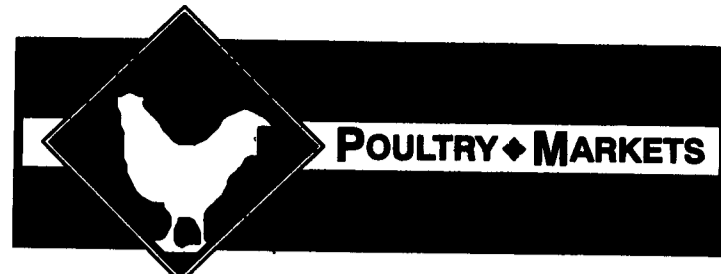

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained seasonally light and unaggressive. Offerings were readily available and spot sales on over 3 pound sizes were noted at 55 cents to stimulate activity. Live supplies were moderate to heavy; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 59 to 73 cents; however, prices were negotiable at several plants. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. Bone in breasts, wings, legs and gizzards were often noted as in heaviest supply. Other items were in balance to fully adequate.

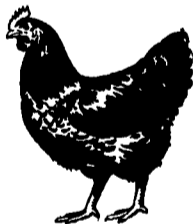

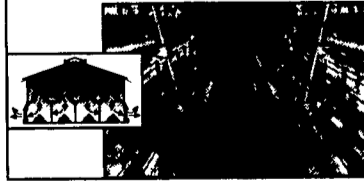

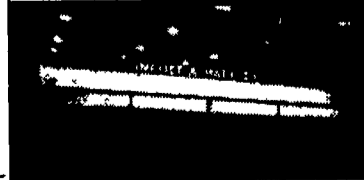
