 JULY 24, 1996
 Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers over 700 lbs weak to 3.00 lower. Calves and yearlings under 700 lbs steady. Demand moderate. The seasonal movement of summer contract feeders to feedlots is placing the usual limits on demand. In addition feeding cattle on 5.00 corn has become a major reality as current close-outs reflect a full turn at top corn prices. Quality of supply plain to average. Flesh conditions remain medium on feeders; medium to fleshy on calves. Average to full weigh-ups are an improvement for buyers compared to last week's full conditions. Slaughter cows .50-1.50 higher. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand good and improved over last weeks sluggish market. Most action coming from buyers out of the North where cows are not as plentiful. Total of 720 cows and bulls sold with 80 percent going to packers. Receipts this week 9,650; last week 12,044; last year 8,706. Supply consisted

of 71 percent yearlings and few calves over 600 lbs; 22 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 7 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
