Shell egg offerings were usually adequate to instances tight. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed in the Eastern region were 11% less than last week, and 7% more than the same week

Demand was fair to good into retail channels, best where featured. Loose egg movement remained good into food service and vacation areas. Supplies of jumbos and mediums were tight to closely balanced, and the large sizes were generally adequate or available. Breaking stock prices were unchanged to higher, and offerings were no more than adequate and held with confidence; breakers expressed concern regarding the relationship between increased shell costs and finished product prices. Live hen offerings remained sufficient.
