## ONE-BOWL BIRTHDAY CAKE

2 squares (2 ounces) sweet chocolate 1/2 cup boiling water 1 cup sifted flour 1 cup sugar 3/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1/4 cup shortening, softened 1/4 cup milk 1 egg

our boiling water over chocolate, stir until melted. and let cool in a big bowl. Sift the dry ingredients over this and beat until smooth. Beat in the shortening, milk, and egg. Pour into a greased and floured 8-inch square pan and bake at 350° F about 35 minutes, until the edges pull away from the sides of the pan. (You can double this recipe for a

3-layer, round cake.) Frost as desired, or sprinkle with sifted confectioners' sugar. Makes 9 servings.
