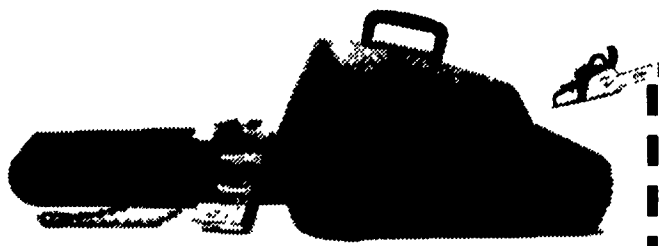

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**Grants Available**

**HARRISBURG (Centre Co.)** — Two grant programs for environmental projects are available through the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts, Inc. (PACD) to help Pennsylvanians take measures to improve water quality.

The Pennsylvania Nonpoint Source Pollution Prevention Mini-Project Education Program is funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) Bureau of Land and Water Conservation and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Section 319 (EPA). Funding for the Pennsylvania Chesapeake Bay Mini-Project Education Program is provided by the DEP and its Pennsylvania Chesapeake Bay Program. Environmental, civic, and community organizations and individuals are encouraged to apply for mini-grant funds.

Eligible projects are awarded grants up to \$750. Applications are available now and must be returned postmarked by Sept. 23. Special consideration will be given for projects focusing on pollution prevention. For more information or to receive an application, contact the PACD at (717) 236-1006.
