## Junior 3-Year-Old Grand At Central District Championship

**HUNTINGDON** (Huntingdon Co.) - The quality of show animals at the Central Pennsylvania Championship Holstein Show held August 17 at the Huntingdon County Fairgrounds surprised and pleased show judge Ronald Heffner of Jefferson, Maryland.

Heffner, who judged the national junior show in Louisville, said the top five Holsteins shown by the youth exhibitors in the juniordivision were comparable to animals shown in Louisville.

"These five animals," Heffner said just before selecting grand champion of the junior show, "all deserve grand champion."

Heffner then selected David Kocher's junior 3-year-old as grand champion of the youth division. Kocher's cow, Hearts Desire Jethro Carla, was sired by Hanoverhill Jethro TW, bred by Eugene Corl and June Kocher.

Rachel said she would be retiring her favorite cow after this championship show. The cow has won a room full of ribbons and trophies for Rachel over the years.


