Prices stabilized and were generally unchanged to instances higher. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand remained moderate with most current negotiated sales for immediate delivery. Floor stocks were no more than adequate. Raw material offerings became slightly more available at unchanged prices, and overall, shell egg supplies were about adequate. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed in the Eastern region under federal inspection for the week ending August 17, 1996 were 1% less than last week, and 2% less than the same week last year.
