Grain and soybean bids fell sharply again, pressured by lack of export demand and increased corn and bean crop estimates from the FCC. Wheat 4 to 13 cents lower. Corn 8 to 28 cents lower. Sorghum 14 to 17 cents lower. Soybeans 15 to 22 cents lower. Wheat bids were shoved lower due to the weakness in corn and bean bids, today. Some export tenders are expected this week but yet to be seen. The FCC increased their corn and soybean crop estimate which put pressure on bids. Traders are a little skeptical about the figure but do believe it will be larger than the USDA's first guess. Very slow export demand this week for all commodities also weighed on bids.
