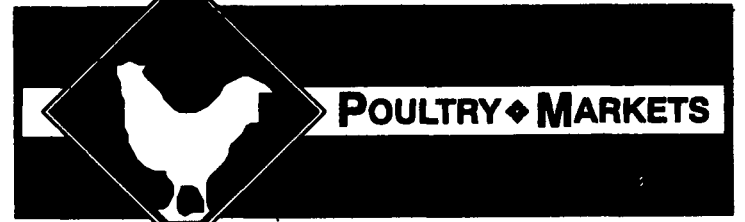

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to good. Offerings were adequate to closely cleared in most quarters. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 59 to 73 cents. Trade sentiment was in a range of steady to firm. In the parts complex, Leg items were adequate to short. Inquiry for Wings increased and supplies were in generally good balance. Breast items were irregularly distributed; however, boneless skinless were slow to clear in some quarters. Bone-in breasts were generally adequate.
