### POTATO SOUFFLE

8 medium potatoes 3 tablespoons butter 3 eggs, separated salt to taste

3 tablespoons grated onion 2 tablespoons minced parsley bread crumbs

oil potatoes Peel and puree or mash while Dhot Cool completely. (This step can be done a day ahead and the potatoes refrigerated) Cream butter until ... light, then work in egg yolks, salt, omon,

and parsley. Mix into mashed potatoes, beating until well blended. Beat egg whites until stiff, then gently fold into potato mixture. Grease soufflé dish and sprinkle bread crumbs on bottom and sides Pour in the potato

mixture and bake at 375° F for about 45 minutes, or until nicely browned and risen.




