SRBC Changes Meeting Date

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Susquehanna River Basin Commission has rescheduled its next meeting from Sept. 19 to Oct. 1.

The 8:30 a.m. meeting is to occur at the Day Inn in Clearfield, located along Rt. 879, near Exit 19 of I80.

On the agenda is a consideration by the commission of a policy/staff guidance document that pertains to settling civil penalty actions.

The commission is also being asked to affirm a new formula for dividing up the commission's spendable budget among the member states and federal government (signatory parties).

Commissioners are to also be asked for ratification of four contracts dealing with nutrient reduction, data base development, restoration of Wiconisco Creek, and acid mine drainage in the Nescopeck Creek Watershed.

In other expected actions, the commission is to review accomplishment of the SRBC during the past six months and to set goals for the next six; and to make a decision on the purchasing of voice mail telephone equipment or services.

The commission is also to be asked to decide on approval of four water-withdrawal project applications.

In Lawrence Township in Tioga County, Ward Manufacturing, ACP Division, is seeking to get approval for the withdrawal of up to 780,000 gallons of groundwater per day from its Wells No.1, 2, and 3; and for the consumptive use of up to 500,000 gallons per day for industrial purposes. In its proposal, Ward has opted to pay the SRBC to provide compensatory water as make-up for the consumptive use.

The Mifflin Township Water Authority in Columbia County is seeking approval for the withdrawal of 432,000 gallons of groundwater per day from Well No. PW-3, for a total system withdrawal limit of 432,000 gallons per day. The water is to be used for the public water supply in Mifflin Township.

Glen Rock Water Company is seeking approval to purchase 500,000 gallons per day (based on a 30-day average) from the York Water Company in York County. A maximum of 15 million gallons per month is proposed in the application.

Milton Hershey School, in Dauphin County, is seeking approval for the withdrawal of up to 609,000 gallons per day from its Wells No. 1, 4, 5, 6, and 7, and for the consumptive use of up to 79,000 gallons per day for irrigation, with the proposal to pay the SRBC as make-up for the consumptive water use.

In other areas, the SRBC is also to hear a report on the results of a Susquehanna River Reconnaissance Study done in cooperation with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, a report on hydrologic conditions in the basin, and staff reports.
