This year's grand champion



mal was shown by Nathaniel Artz. with 2.346 pounds per day and it ended with a 7.96-inch loin eve and a 1.4-inch backfat layer which disqualified it from final competition.

Kirk Artz showed the reserve champion for rate of gain, and it too was disqualified from final competition because of too much back fat.

Overall, there were 16 disqual-

ifications attributed to poor meat quality, too much back fat, or being too heavy or too long.

In the on-foot competition, Winebark's entry was champion heavyweight. The champion middleweight was Atkins' entry, while Janine Winebark showed the reserve champion middleweight (disqualified from final because of meat condition).

The champion lightweight animal was shown by Jermiah.

Arnold, while the reserve lightweight was shown by Lonny

Lenker. Disqualification from final competition is not considered to be a reflection on the participant's abilities, but it does reinforce the fact that each aspect of producing market hogs for the industry has to oe considered, and that relying only on show ring competitions does not provide that type of understanding.
