Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 60 to 74 cents. Trade sentiment was cautiously steady. Bone-in breast were ample and slow to clear. Boneless skinless breast and leg quarters were fully adequate. Other leg items and wings were generally in good balance.

EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, SEPTEMBER 13, 1996. FEDERAL-STATE
 Prices were unchanged to higher for yolks and blends, and unchanged on the balance. The market tone was fully steady to firm for yolks, and mostly steady for other items. Demand was fair to good, and remained focused on immediate needs. Floor stocks were no more than adequate. Breaking stock supplies were generally adequate for the moderate demand, and prices were unchanged. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the Labor Day week ending *Q5 17, 1996 were 24% less than last week, and 11% less than the same week last year.
