DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Wheat bids were slightly higher due to anticipated export sales for hard red winter wheat. Corn bids were mixed, lower on profit taking and harvest pressure but overnight export demand added some support. Soybean bids moved higher due to strong wheat bids. Wheat 3 to 6 cents higher. Corn mixed, 5 cents higher to 4 cents lower. Sorghum 1 to 2 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 8 cents higher. Indications that there are a few countries seeking Hard Red Winter for September through November shipment. This, added strength to some wheat bids. The lack of actual sales the past few days continued to pressure other wheat bids along with profit taking on the board. Corn bids fell lower again today as some liquidation on the board offered weakness. Corn harvest is nearly underway if weather permits. Light export demand overnight, limited losses.

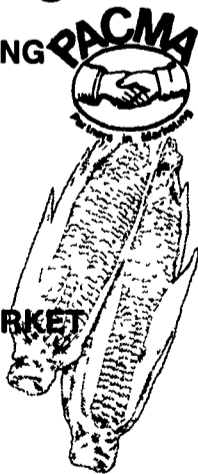
