

York Fair Names Junior Dairy Show Winners

YORK (York Co.) — A junior two-year-old Holstein edged out the Brown Swiss champion to get the nod for Supreme Champion of the York Fair's junior dairy show.

"Beshore Adan Juniper-ET," exhibited by 13-year-old Angie Beshore, New Cumberland, gained an advantage due to being "tremendously dairy and open ribbed." She is scored VG-85 and still milking 80 pounds after her March freshening.

The judging team of John Burket and Steve Shaw, who placed the youth dairy classes and paired for the Supreme selection, indicated that their top two selections were very close.

"This is a good pair of milking two-year-olds. If ever there was a tie for Supreme, this is it," said Shaw, speaking for the judging duo.

The Brown Swiss champion is "Wind Mill Hammer Colleen," a senior two-year-old exhibited by Nathan Hostetter, Dover. Though fresh since January and soon due to be turned dry, Colleen is still milking at 70 pounds.

Other breed champions in contention for the Supreme title were "Goodies Ann Corben Alice," the four-year-old Ayrshire winner exhibited by Jess Stambaugh, East Berlin, "Brightside PP Mavis," Doyle Hostetter's junior two-year-old Guernsey, the Jersey junior calf, "Hill Acres Shellys Sherry," exhibited by Suzann Pomraning, Delta, and "Joy-el Erica," a senior two-year-old Milking Shorthorn exhibited by Heather Crowl, Airville.

In the Ayrshire breed show, Nevin Hostetter, Dover took reserve senior and grand champion with a senior two-year-old "AK Patriot Jellybean."

Junior champion was "Wentworth-Farm Ms Merrilee," a winter calf, and the reserve junior champion was the spring calf "Wentworth-Farm Heidi Ho," both exhibited by Susan Richardson, Fawn Grove.

Reserve senior and grand champion Brown Swiss was "IE Brothers-Three Belle," Heather Crowl's senior two-year-old. Airville 4-H'er Lisa Jones claimed the junior champion honor with "Brothers Three Jetway Lily," a fall calf, over the reserve winter yearling, "Muddy Run Aytola Sidney," exhibited by Kelly Jo Myers.

Guernsey reserve senior and grand champion was Doyle Hostetter's senior two-year-old "Brightside N Andrea." Topping the heifer placings were the junior champion "Rutter Bros Magics Wendy," a winter calf, and "Rutter Bros Perfectos Lydia," a winter yearling, both exhibited by Terri Johnson.

Amy Trimmer, East Berlin, claimed reserve senior and grand champion of the Holstein competition with her three-year-old "Gentle Touch Chr Val Roxy." Junior champion honors went to Angie Beshore with her fall yearling "Beshore Stardust Linda." Taking reserve junior champion spot was Amy Trimmer's fall calf "Coredale Royal Hopie."

In addition to her junior and grand champion spring calf which topped the Jersey show, Suzann Pomraning also took reserve junior and grand honors with a winter yearling, "Franken Theodore Lilli."

Jessica Hostetter nabbed two top spots in the Milking Shorthorn

show, exhibiting her dry two-year-old, "Pinesedge Cav Jillian-Exp" to the reserve senior and grand spot, and taking the junior championship with her winter calf "J H Master Paige." Reserve junior champion was the fall calf exhibited by Sonni Lea Mayberry, Airville, "Joyel Master Snap."

More than 40 York County junior dairy exhibitors participated in the showmanship competition, finishing in a tight contest between the four age class winners which judges called a virtual tie. However, senior class winner Kelly Jo Myers, Thomasville, was selected the champion showman. Also in contention for the top showmanship prize were Amy Trimmer, East Berlin, age group 13-15, Susan Richardson, Fawn Grove, ages 10-12 and Terri Johnson, York, ages 8-9.

"Coredale Calypso Janis" is a VG-88 five-year-old with an Excellent-scored mammary system. She has completed her third lactation in the Thompson's East Berlin dairy herd with over 23,000 milk.

Open class dairy judges John Burket, East Freedom, and Steve Shaw, Williamsburg, teamed together to select the fair's overall winning cow from the field of breed champion contenders.
