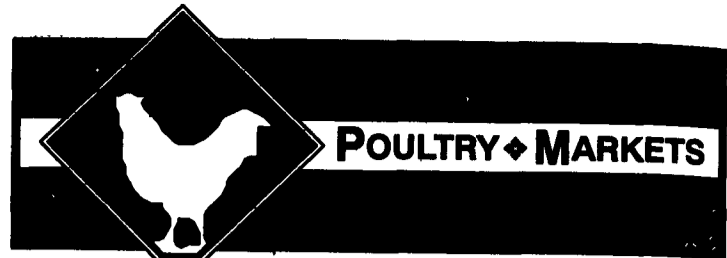

Prices were unchanged to higher for yolks and whites, and unchanged on the balance. The market tone was steady to instances firm. Demand continued fair to good, and negotiations were for current delivery. Floor stocks were no more than adequate. Breaking stock supplies were generally adequate from regular sources, and prices were unchanged; the market tone was steady. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending September 14, 1996 were 21% more than last week, and 7% less than the same week last year.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was sluggish. Seller offerings were noted as ample and generally slow to clear. Live supplies remained mostly moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were lower at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate or available; however, buying interest was limited.

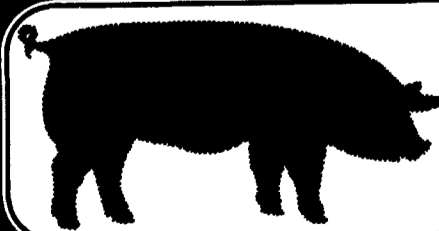
