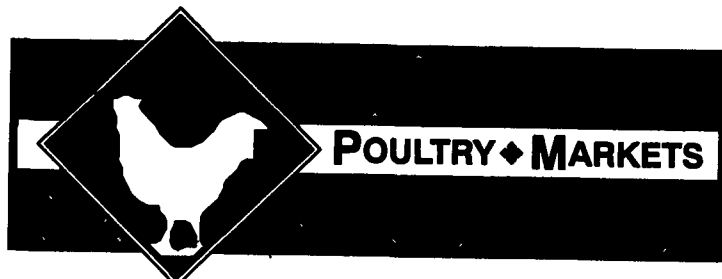

PRICES PAID TO PRODUCERS IN NEW ENGLAND FOR LARGE AND EXTRA LARGE WERE LOWER, AND THE BALANCE WAS UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO WEAK FOR THE LARGER SIZES AND STEADY TO FIRM FOR MEDIUMS. DEMAND WAS MOSTLY FAIR. 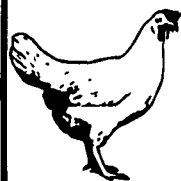

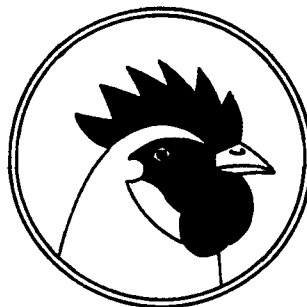

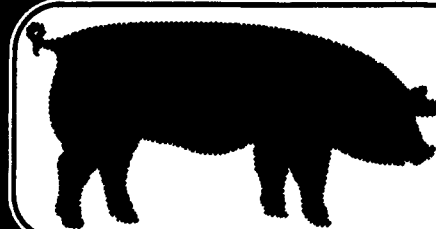
