GRILLED SALMON & WATERCRESS-MUSTARD

Salmon for six, about 3 pounds, in 1-inch thick steaks
 Watercress-Mustard Sauce
 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
 1 cup minced watercress, leaves and stems
 1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard
 1 tablespoon minced shallots
 salt and pepper to taste
 additional watercress sprigs for garnish

rack on lowest setting. Season salmon steaks with salt and pepper and dot with about half the sauce. Grill 5 minutes, turn, dot with remaining sauce, and grill another 3 to 5 minutes, until just opaque. Transfer to plates and garnish with additional watercress sprigs. Serve hot.

Makes 6 servings.

Prepare sauce, preferably a day ahead, and refrigerate to let seasonings blend. Place broiler

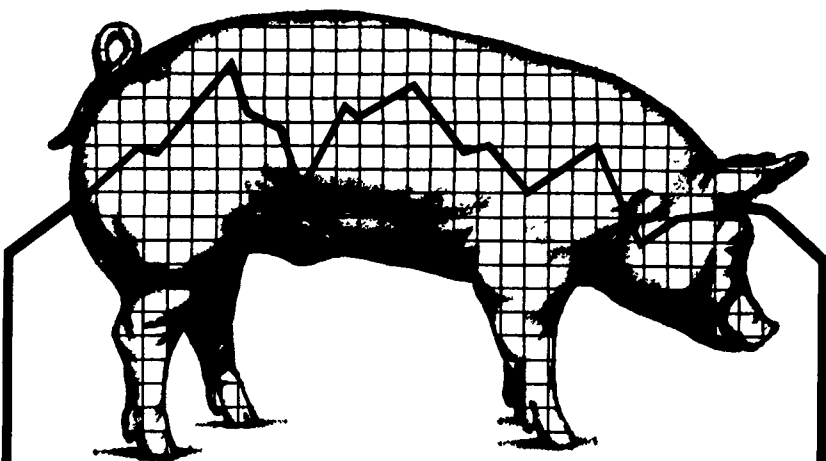

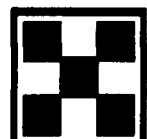
