Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was generally light and unaggressive. Seller offerings were available and excess product was often noted as slow to clear. Live supplies were moderate to heavy; weights varied in a full range of light to heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 57 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to weak. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate. Leg items were in best balance. Breast cuts and wings were readily available, and buyers generally opted to await further market developments prior to making commitments.
