PUMPKIN MOLASSES PIE

- 2 nine-inch piecrusts,
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon sait
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon ginger 3 eggs
- 1-1/2 cups pureed cooked
- pumpkin 1-1/2 cups light cream
- 3 tablespoons molasses
- whipped cream (optional)

reheat oven to 400° F Bake piecrusts, weighted with pie beans, for 10

minutes. Remove weights, prick crusts, and bake another 10 minutes. Cool. Combine sugar, spices, and pumpkin. Beat together eggs, cream, and molasses. Combine two mixtures and beat. Divide filling between pie shells and bake for 10 minutes Reduce heat to 350° and bake 30 minutes, or until a

> knife comes out clean. Cool. Serve with whipped cream, if desired. Makes 2 nineinch pies.
