DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Wheat bids were slightly lower as world wheat production estimates are expected to increase and the moisture received Tuesday in many winter wheat growing areas was a welcome sight. However, corn and bean harvest was brought to a halt, due to the snow storm, pushing bids higher. Wheat 1 to 3 cents lower. Corn 2 to 5 cents higher. Sorghum 4 to 7 cents higher. Soybeans 5 to 10 cents higher. Wheat bids were lower after beneficial snows fell in winter wheat growing areas yesterday. Light overnight export orders for wheat also weighed on bids. Corn and soybean bids reacted strongly to yesterday's snow storm. Traders concerns that some beans might have been damaged by the cold, wind and snow added support. Corn harvest was already behind normal and this will only slow it further. Indications there may be potential corn and bean sales in the works this week, offered strength.

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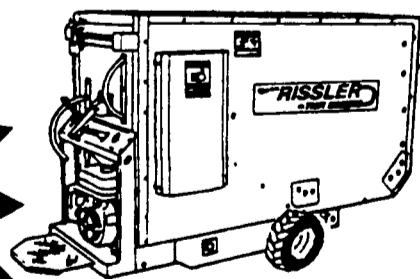

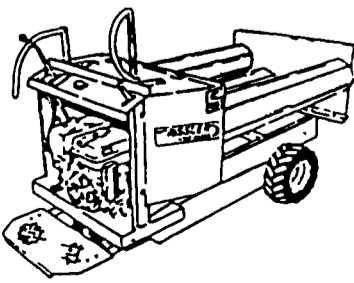
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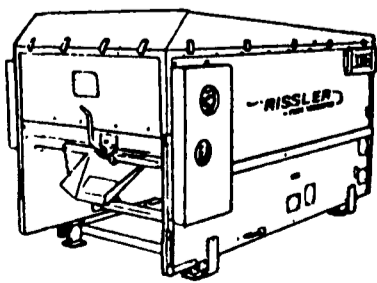
