

**National Grain Market**

 Wheat bids climbed higher due to continued reactions from yesterday's reduced ending stocks estimate by USDA and fairly good export sales overnight. Corn and soybean bids were mixed. Wheat 2 to 11 cents higher. Corn mixed. Sorghum 7 to 9 cents higher. Soybeans mixed. Wheat bids were moderately higher as the Philippines purchase wheat overnight. Indications are Egypt is looking for 300,000 tonnes of optional-origin wheat today but it's not expected to come from the US. Spillover strength from yesterday's USDA Stocks Report was noted. Good export demand for corn overnight offered some support to corn bids but the soybean meal sales were't enough to boost bean bids very high. Cold temperatures and freezing rain forecast for the Midwest areas over the next few days, weighed on bids. U.S. Export Sales: Commodity Ton-
