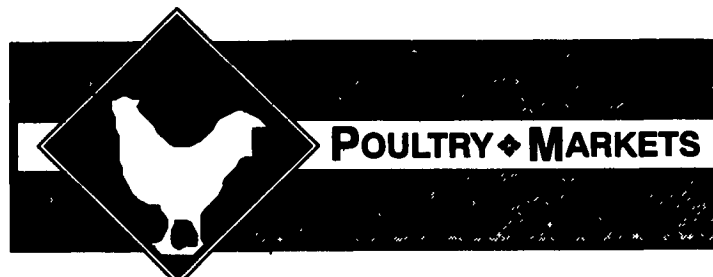

Prices were higher for yolks and whole egg, and whites were generally unchanged. The market tone was fully steady to firm with yolks and whole egg in the strongest position. Demand was active, and generally good. Frozen egg floor stocks were tight to instances adequate. Raw material supplies were also tight to adequate, and prices were higher. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection the week ending November 9, 1996 in the Eastern region were 3% more than both last week and the same week last year.
