Robinson, Kindigs Honored At Lancaster Ag Industry Banquet

mer advisor for 30 years in the Eastern Lancaster County School District. He is credited with the growth of the vegetable industry and helped to initiate the Leola Produce Auction.

Robinson helped develop the Ag Horizons program and served on the advisory board for five years, and he is an advisor to the Pennsylvania Nutrient Management Board.

A captain in the U.S. Army Medical Service for three years, he served one year in Vietnam. He and his wife Evelyn have eight children, and they are active in church and community events.

In making the presentation, Roger Rohrer, chairman of the Chamber Ag Committee said the award was made for Robinson's "effort in expanding ag production profitability and ag education in Lancaster County."

James Shirk, Chamber ag services manager, reviewed the past year. Because of the new real estate tax base reassessment, the state clean and green program got a lot of attention. In addition, work is developing for an ag exhibit with the Hands-On House that will reach 280,000 children over the next seven years. The exhibit is expected to be completed by next spring.

In addition, the ag services committee continues to provide economic development information and will be involved with the International Day program at the 1997 Pennsylvania Farm Show in January.

"We are committed to make a strong and growing agriculture industry in southeast Pennsylvania, the bread basket of the East Coast," Shirk said. "We want to help insure a profitable ag industry

in Lancaster County."

State Deputy Secretary Chris Herr brought greetings from Charles Brosius, Pennsylvania agriculture secretary. Herr said Farm City Week recognizes the interdependence of our farms and communities and listed farming as the foundation of the Commonwealth. He said farming is the "economic engine" that fuels the entire economy.

John Schwartz, Lancaster County agriculture agent, introduced J. Robert and Roberta L. Kindig, Conestoga, as the recipients of the 1996 Century Farm award. Bob is the great-grandson of Eli Kindig, who purchased the 117-acre farm toward the end of the last century

for \$100 per acre. The farmhouse was built in 1896. They milk 50 Holstein cows and grow out young stock for herd replacements.

The keynote speaker was Judson Hale, Sr., Dublin, NH, the 12th editor-in chief of *The Old Farmer's Almanac* that has been published every year since 1792. Hale told of his experiences as he continues to appear on hundreds of radio and television shows throughout the county.

J. Roger Moyer, Jr., board of directors chairman, brought greetings from the Chamber. Ken Meck, immediate past chairman of the agriculture committee, was master of ceremonies. Four hundred and forty people attended.
