## 4-H Horse Enthusiasts Come Out Winning

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — State 4-H horse club members were honored recently at the 37th annual State 4-H Horse Show, Oct. 25-27 at the State Farm Show Complex.

The primary purpose of the state 4-H horse program is to develop life skills in youth and skills in horse management. 4-H'ers develop riding skills, gain self-confidence, and learn proper care of animals.

The state show culminates the year for approximately 7,000 Pennsylvania 4-H members enrolled in horse and pony 4-H clubs. To be eligible for this show, 4-H'ers had to advance through qualifying shows at county, regional, and district levels.

More than 900 winners from the county and district competitions vied for awards. Events tested skills in showmanship, equitation, pleasure, jumping, driving, and timed events.




