## Pork Production Forum Dec. 18

ADAMSTOWN (Lancaster Co.) — The annual Pork Production Forum is scheduled Wednesday, Dec. 18 from 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. at Weaver's Market on the corner of Rts. 897 and 272.

Sponsored by the LanChester Pork Producers, the forum will examine a range of carcass value pricing systems of hog packers, in addition to sustainable pork production.

The forum includes a free family style lunch. Morning topics include:

- "Carcass Value Pricing Systems of Hog Packers" by Dave Kenyon, Virginia Tech University.
- "Hatfield Carcass Value Pricing System" by Jeff Arner, hog procurement.
- "Sustainable Pork Production, PQA, and Environmental Assurance" by Ken Kephart, extension swine specialist, Penn State.

Two seminars will be part of the afternoon session:

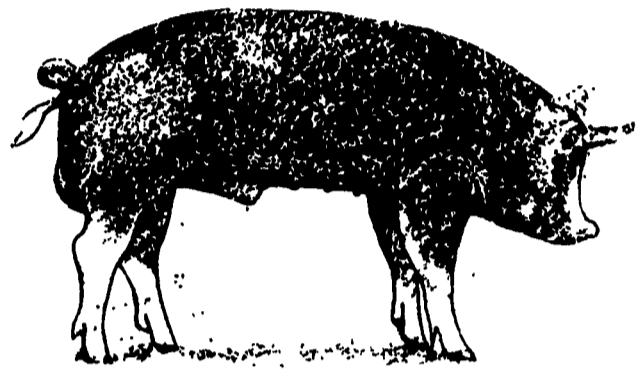
- Pork Quality Assurance Level III: 1st Time Certification by Dr. Tim Trayer.
