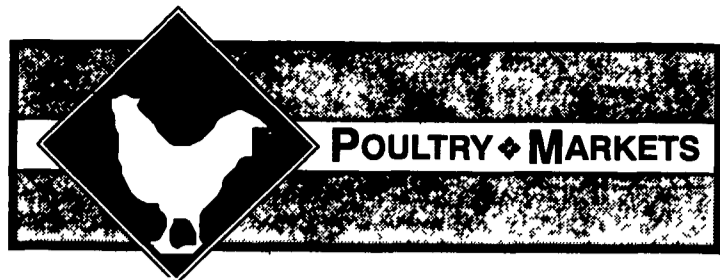

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds varied from plant to plant, but generally remained less than anticipated for early month. Seller offerings were irregular, but fully sufficient for current inquiry. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 61 to 75 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts and occasionally wings cleared well; however, overall movement was disappointing, and various items were increasing in availability, particularly leg quarters.

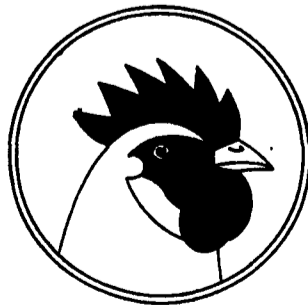
