Offerings were generally adequate for hens, fully adequate for toms. Bulk parts movement was also fairly light with 1.5 loads of full-cut tom wings moving at 46-46.5 cents and 2 loads of torn necks at 41 cents. Bulk meat activity centered on 3 loads of fresh tom breast meat without tenders moving at open prices. Trade sentiment for thigh meat was fully steady. 
