

# Why a Beef Checkoff on Dairy Calves?

- The mandatory beef checkoff requires that one dollar per head be assessed on all sales of bovine animals — regardless of size, breed or value The checkoff was designed to be fair to all producers — everyone benefits, everyone invests
- ✓ Dairy producers earn approximately 10% to 15% of their net income from beef sales Whether you're selling cull cows or bulls; bred or open females; veal or bull calves to be fed by someone else; steers or any other bovine, a dollar on each head sold is remitted to your state beef council Each segment of the industry contributes to the total pounds of beef for sale at the grocery store or restaurant. When prices are good, everyone benefits. Therefore, everyone pays — even in a down market
- The \$1-per-head checkoff cannot guarantee a profit on each head sold. There are numerous other factors, such as feed prices, weather, and supply that contribute to the purchase or selling price of each animal. The checkoff is in place to help increase demand for beef and veal, thereby increasing the potential to make a profit on animals.
- Nationally, 20% 25% of beef on the market comes from dairy cattle, including about 45% of all ground beef sold. Promotions designed to target ground beef, such as this summer's beef and Kraft cheese retail promotion, help improve ground beef sales
- It is sometimes hard to see the benefits of the checkoff when the value of calves and cull cows is depressed. But, take away the beef/veal checkoff and we will quickly lose our market share to poultry and alternative protein sources. We will lose our strong relationship with health professionals; our stories about beef and veal in magazines; our televisions ads; and, eventually, demand for your animals.
- Almost all of the people working on checkoff programs have farm backgrounds. Their families are suffering through this cattle cycle - just like you. Their hearts are involved in the industry. They are working hard to assure that the income made on an animal is the best it can be under the circumstances.
