Bulletin Provides Forage Preservation Info

EBENSBURG (Cambria Co.) - Forage crops - legumes, grasses, and corn silage — form the basis of the nutritional programs on dairy, beef, and sheep farms. From the moment that crops are cut until they are delivered to animals, biological processes take place that decrease their quantity and nutritional quality as feeds. Silage and Hay Preservation, NRAES-5, provides a wealth of practical information and scientific backgrounds on management forage preservation to reduce losses and quality changes. Proper management results in more efficient production and greater farm

The 53-page bulletin in divided into three sections: The Biology of Silage Preservation, Preservation of Hay, and Additives for Silage and Hay Preservation. In the first two sections, the processes that affect forage quality are described, and management prac-

tices to control these processes are discussed. The additives section described their impact on forage preservation and includes a frank assessment of the usefulness of eight categories of additives.

Silage and Hay Preservation, NRAES-5, was written by R.E. Pitts, a professor of agricultural and biological engineeing at Cornell University.
