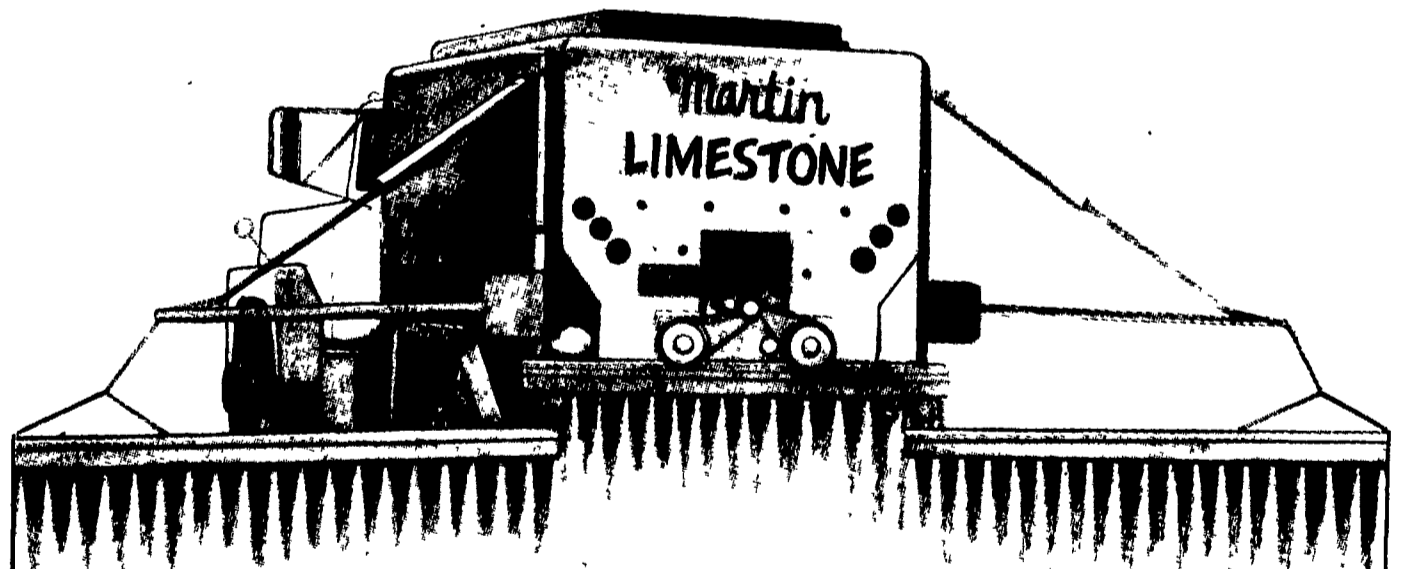
Galen Mull
