Milk Administrator Announces Prices

ALEXANDRIA, Va. — Middle Atlantic Order Market Administrator Rex F. Luthrop announced a producer nonfat milk solids price of 99 cents per pound for December 1996.

The weighted average differential base milk price was \$3.69 per hundredweight and the price per pound of butterfat was 77.04 cents.

The producer NFMS price was down 20 cents from last year while the base differential increased \$2.62.

The standardized base milk price per hundredweight for producer milk with the market average nonfat milk solids content and 3.5 percent butterfat would have been \$15.06 and the excess price would have been \$11.37. This represents a base price increase of \$1.06 per hundredweight from the previous year. The excess price decreased \$1.56 from the previous December.

The nonfat milk solids price, applicable to handler payments, was 99.61 cents per pound for the month, down 20.07 cents from last December. The weighted average price for December was \$14.73 per hundredweight and would have been approximately 8 cents lower without the effect of the

Mr. Lothrop said that the December volume or producer milk pooled under the Order, 539.1 million pounds, was up 23.4 million pounds or 4.5 percent from last December.

The average daily delivery per producer of 3,307 pounds in December was down 194 pounds or 5.5 percent from a year earlier. A total of 5,258 producers supplied Order 4 pool handlers during the month, 507 more than last December.

Total nonfat milk solids production for the month was 47.2 million pounds. This represents an average NFMS test of 8.76 percent, up from 8.75 percent last December.

Class I producer milk totaled 249.9 million pounds and accounted for 46.36 percent of total producer milk receipts in December. The December 1995 Class I utilization was 45.76 percent. The volume of Class I producer milk was up 5.9 percent from a year ago.

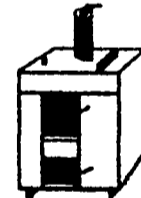
Base milk accounted for 89.83 percent of total December producer milk deliveries, down from 90.87 percent last December. The average butterfat test of producer
