Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers steady. Demand good and improved throughout the trading session. Stocker cattle and calves firm to 2.00 higher; steers at full advance. Demand excellent for stockers. Quality of supply average to attractive for genetics. However feeders off dry and nutritionally strong wheat continue to do well and fleshier each week. Feeder flesh medium to moderately fleshy. Weigh-ups full to mainly average. Stocker flesh highly varied from very thin to fleshy new crop calves. Not much discounting on new crops. Slaughter cows steady. Slaughter bulls 1.00-2.00 higher. Packer demand good for limited slaughter numbers. Many cows heavy bred and returning to country, also several thin cows headed to graze-out. Total of 500 cows and bulls sold with 50 percent to packers. Receipts this week 16,650; last week 8,683; last year 10,621. Supply consisted of 72 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 25 percent calves under 600 lbs; 3 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis. 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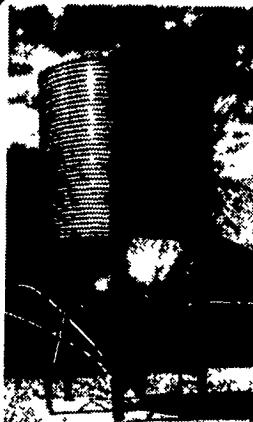
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
