MAYFLOWER LAUNCHING

Forty years ago, on March 16, 1957, the Mayflower's shallop was launched in Plymouth, Massachusetts. It was a reproduction of the Pilgrim ship, of course, not the original, but we salute it nonetheless. A shallop (from the French *chaloupe* or Dutch *sloop*, for sloop) is an open boat fitted with oars or sails or both. Despite the animosity that brought the early settlers from England in the first place, the English and Americans would have agreed on the old English saying, "A ship under sail, a man complete with armour, and a woman with a great belly are three of the handsomest sights."

BROILED EGGPLANT

- 1 medium eggplant
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 tablespoons basil pesto
- salt and pepper
- juice of 1 lemon
- grated Parmesan



until the eggplant is golden and soft in the center. Remove from heat. Sprinkle with salt and pepper, coat with a thin layer of basil pesto, and sprinkle with lemon juice. Return to the broiler for just a couple of minutes to warm, then serve immediately with grated Parmesan.

Makes 4 servings, as a side dish.

Coat broiler pan with some of the olive oil. Slice eggplant into 1/2-inch rounds and place on the pan, then brush with remaining olive oil. Broil a few inches from the heat for about 10 minutes.
