Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds vas seasonally light and unaggressive. Seller offerings were readily available and were slow in clearing. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights varied, and were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 66 cents. Trade sentiment remained weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, wings were adequate and in best balance.
