LIBERTY (Tioga Co.) — Spring has sprung in Pennsylvania and that means it's time for Pennsylvania Jersey breeders to head to Schuylkill County for the 1997 Pennsylvania Jersey Convention.

Scheduled for Friday, April 18 and Saturday, April 19, at the River Inn in Pottsville, the annual gathering will allow young and old to share their experiences with Jerseys, watch as a new Jersey Queen is crowned, applaud for many award recipients and bid on one of many top notch consignments for the annual spring sale. The festivities kick off at 6:00 Friday night with a social hour followed by the youth awards banquet. During the evening program, Pennsylvania will crown a new queen and will distribute youth achievement awards, production awards and scholarships.

While at the banquet, Jersey enthusiasts will feast on a choice of Roast Turkey with dressing or Ham Hawaiian. Both meals are \$12 per person (children under 10, \$6 each).

The Distinguished Service award will also be presented at this time to Jersey breeders who have dedicated much of their lives

Following a pre-sale meal at Meadowview Farm, Pine Grove, PA, the Pennsylvania Spring Jersey cattle sale is sure to draw some attention as consignments from across the nation are led across the auction block.

Starting at noon, the sale features consignments from Pennsylvania and across the nation sired by Khan, Bold Daniel, Berretta, Barber, Alf and many others.

Included in the sale are heifers with flush potential, choice of flushes and many herd building heifers ready to freshen.

Also offered at the sale will be several Pot of Gold calves for the younger crowd. Twenty-five percent of the gross from the sale of these animals will be set aside in a Pot of Gold fund to be distributed in the year 2000. The owner of the calf which made the highest production record on her first lactation wins part of the "Pot of Gold" as do the second and third place winners. 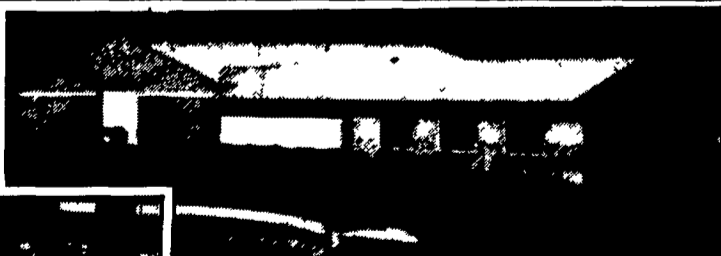
