The Cumberland County 4-H Dairy Achievement Banquet was held recently in Newburg. Several 4-H members were recognized for their efforts.

•Outstanding 4-H Dairy Member. The Outstanding 4-H Dairy member for 1996 was Rebecca Cornman. Becky has just completed her seventh year in the Cumberland County Dairy Club and is the daughter of Deb and Steve Cornman of Boiling Springs. This past year she exhibited the champion and reserve champion Jersey at the 1996 County 4-H Roundup.

She kept records and showed five project animals and com-

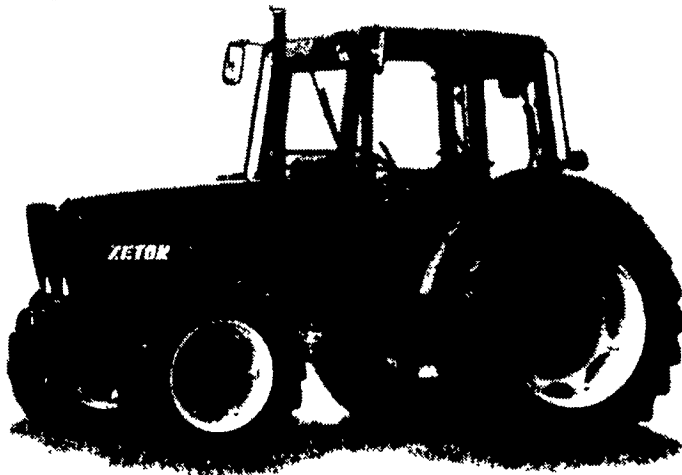
