Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast, Midwest, and Southeast, and unchanged elsewhere. The market tone remained steady to weak. Demand was mixed across the full range and was mostly light to moderate. Supplies were adequate to ample with large the most available. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate for the moderate demand, and many breakers awaited further shell egg price reductions. Offerings of light type fowl were generally adequate.

Delmarva Broiler **APRIL 9, 1997** Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained good and seller offerings were

generally no more than adequate. Live supplies were moderate; weights were in a range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 54 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment remained firm. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate to ample and were generally slow in clearing. Bonein breasts were irregularly balanced, but were adequate and clearing satisfactorily at most plants. Leg quarters and wings were
