Soybeans steady to 5 cents lower. Plenty of moisture and new crop wheat is looking good in most places. Early Spring freeze damage is still up in the air, but this is not hurting as much as lack of export orders. Com is still the number 1 price determinate in the grain and soybean trade. A large part of the crop will be planted in the next two weeks. More progress has been made in the Eastem Combelt than the Western Combelt, just the opposite of last year. However, rain is in the forecast for tonight and tomorrow. Export orders need to do much better than they have the past three or four days, nothing on the books. Soybeans are enjoying the moment. 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
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
