Compared to last week: Feeder cattle firm to 2.00 higher. Demand very good for

feeders. Calves and stockers 1.00-3.00 higher with new crop calves 9.00 higher. Demand excellent for grazing cattle. Buyers forced to purchase new crop unweaned calves to fill their needs as not enough thin dry wintered calves available for the demand. Quality of supply average to many attractive. Weigh-ups varied gaunt to full. Feeder flesh lighter than normally expected for May cattle off wheat. Flesh condition mainly medium to slightly fleshy and less than the February-March off wheat run. Slaughter cows 50-1.00 lower with moderate packer demand. Slaughter bulls 1.50-2.00 lower with fair demand for increase supply of bulls. 550 cows and bulls sold with 60 percent to packers. Receipts this week 12,850; last week 5,581; last year 10,120. Supply consisted of 78 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 18 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
