ammertus, Pancras, and Gervais (or Gervatius) are the "Three Chilly Saints" who celebrate their feasts each year on May 11, 12, and 13. The three became known in weatherlore for predicting what were traditionally the three coldest days of the month Germans



knew these days as *Icemanner*, or the Iceman Days, and farmers knew better than to plant vulnerable seedlings before the Icemen had come and gone The English and French saw the Three Chilly Saints as harbingers of a late spring frost

RHUBARB COBBLER

1/2 cup sugar 1/4 cup cornstarch 2 tablespoons water 4 cups cooked, sweetened rhubarb 1 tablespoon butter

TOPPING: 1-1/2 cups biscuit mix

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

1 tablespoon sugar

3 tablespoons

melted butter 1/3 cup milk

Mix the 1/2 cup sugar with the cornstarch and water until it is smooth Add to cooked rhubarb, and heat just to boiling. Pour into a baking dish and dot with butter. Combine topping ingredients to make a biscuit dough. Drop by large spoonfuls over the top

of the rhubarb. Sprinkle with additional sugar, if desired, and bake for 30 minutes at 400° F

Makes 6 servings.


