Compared to last week: Feeder steers and steer calves steady. Feeder heifers steady to 2.00 higher; heifer calves steady. Demand good. Quality of supply plain to mostly average, few attractive and well below last week. Bulk of sales feeder cattle off wheat in medium to moderate flesh, end fleshy and continuing lighter in flesh than the norm of a May wheat run. Slaughter cows and bulls 1.00-1.50 higher. Packer demand good with widespread participation. Total of 600 cows and bulls sold with 55 percent going to packers. The Oklahoma National Stockyards will be closed Memorial day with the feeder cattle sale starting on Tuesday followed by cow and bull sale Wednesday. Receipts this week 15,900; last week 13,369; last year 13,975. Supply consisted of 86 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 10 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
