

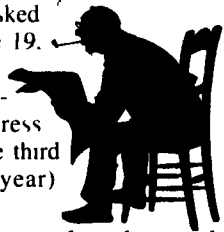

### HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

The first Father's Day, celebrated on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, Washington, was started thanks to Mrs. John Dodd, who suggested it to the Spokane Ministerial Association and her local YMCA. Mrs. Dodd's father, William Jackson Smart, had raised his six children by himself on their Washington farm after Mrs. Smart died in childbirth. Mr. Smart's birthday, June 5, was the date suggested, but the good ministers of Spokane asked that the date be changed to June 19. They felt they needed extra time to prepare sermons on the unexplored subject of fathers! Congress officially changed the date to the third Sunday in June (June 15 this year) back in 1972.

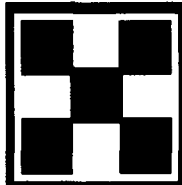

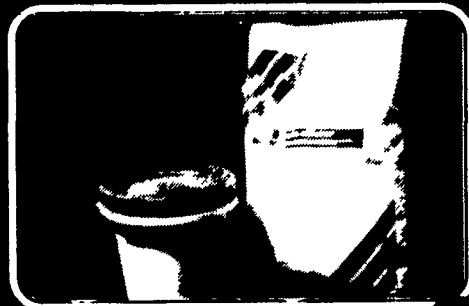
