Jersey Show Affidavits Due

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — Junior exhibitors planning to show at the All American Junior Jersey Show in Louisville, Kentucky, need to be aware of the following eligibility rules.

Registration certificates must show ownership of junior's project animals registered in the name of the junior exhibitor.

If the animal is not registered solely in the junior exhibitors name, the animal must have qualified to be shown as a 4-H/FFA project in the junior exhibitor's

home state by August 1 of the current show year.

Affidavits of said qualifications must be received in the office of the American Jersey Cattle Association by August 1 of the year to be shown.

Affidavits cannot list more than two animals for each All American Junior Show class.

Transfers must be received by August 1, 1997.

Affidavits can be requested from the American Jersey Cattle Association.
