moderate to good. Best demand centered on cattle that would finish their feedlot tour after September or those capable of going to fall rye and wheat pastures. Quality of supply plain to average. Feeder cattle in mostly medium to moderate flesh with average to full weigh conditions. Slaughter cows 1.00-2.00 higher. Slaughter bulls 3.00 higher. Demand from packers good. Total of 460 cows and bulls sold with 60 percent going to packers. Receipts this week 7,350; last week 9,982; last year 13,276. Supply consisted of 82 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 12 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. 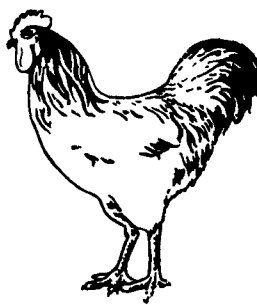

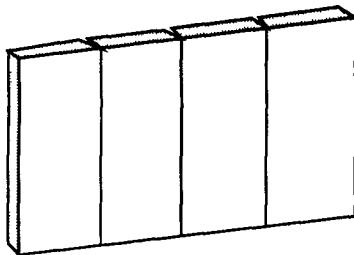

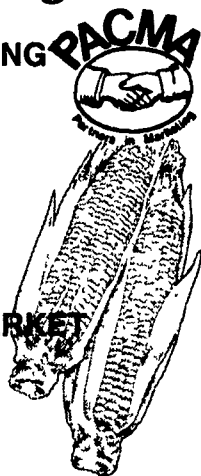
