Oats, No. 2 — 2.05 bu., 6.40

Soybeans, No. 1 — 8.01 bu., 13.38 cwt.


Ear Corn — 85.47 ton, 4.27 cwt. Alfalfa Hay — 112.50 ton, 5.63

Timothy Hay — 113.75 ton, 5.69 cwt.


