State Vet School Offers Llama, Alpaca Lecture

KENNETT SQUARE (Chester Co.) — Following the overwhelming success of the "Introduction to the Llama Lecture" which took place May 15, the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine will offer a second free course for llama and alpaca owners at New Bolton Center (NBC) in Kennett Square, on Thursday, July 10 at 7 p.m.

"Reproduction in Llamas and Alpacas" is to be taught by Dr. Sylvia Bedford, and cover the basic reproductive principles of llamas and alpacas and the handling of these camelids for breeding management.

In addition, Dr. Bedford is to discuss how veterinarians can help owners in evaluating reproductive

problems for diagnosis and treatment. The program is expected to last an hour.

Dr. Sylvia J. Bedford graduated from the Veterinary School in Barcelona in 1991 and received her MA in equine reproduction at Colorado State University (1991-1993). Dr. Bedford went on to attend Tufts University (1993-1996) as a resident in internal medicine. Her special area of interest is in llama and alpaca medicine and reproduction.

She currently teaches courses in llama and alpaca reproduction at both the University of Pennsylvania and Tufts University. At present, Dr. Bedford is doing her residency in reproduction at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine.

The lecture will take place in the Woerner Amphitheater of the George D. Widener Hospital of New Bolton Center. Parking is free. New Bolton Center is located at 382 West Street Road, Kennett Square.
