JULY 9, 1997

Compared to last Monday: Feeder steers and heifers steady to 1.00 higher. Calves and stockers steady to 3.00 lower. Demand for feeder cattle very good. Anticipation of another bumper corn crop continues to drive the feeder market. Calf demand good but edge is off some with buyers more quality conscious as grass makes its seasonal decline in protein. Weigh-ups average to full. Quality plain to average. Feeder flesh medium to slightly fleshy. Slaughter cows steady to 1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand good. Total of 410 cows and bulls sold with 85 percent to packers. Receipts this week 7,100; last week 7,592; last year 14,389. Supply consisted of 75 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 19 percent calves under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighed average weight and price in parenthesis. 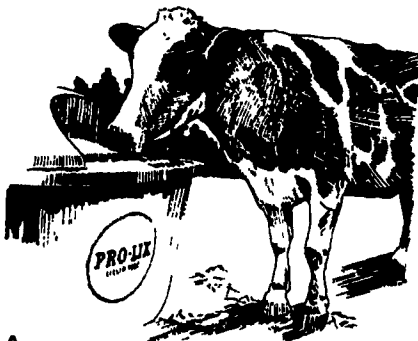
