Eighth Ag Horizons Conference Announced

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Convinced that new and future biotechnology and communication technology will have a tremendous impact on the success of Pennsylvania agriculture, the 1997 Ag Horizons Planning Committee has scheduled experts to discuss both areas at its upcoming conference.

The Ag Horizons Conferences are designed to provide ag educators (Penn State Extension staff, instructors of vocational agriculture and young farmer adult advisors) with an opportunity to be updated annually on cooperative and agricultural developments impacting farmers in eastern and central PA.

The Wildwood Conference Center of Harrisburg Area Community College will be the setting for the eighth annual conference scheduled for Tuesday, July 29, 1997. The Conference begins at 9 a.m. with registration and a continental breakfast, includes lunch, and will conclude at approximately 3:30 p.m.

Discussing Animal biotechnology will be Dr. Roland Leach, Professor of Poultry Science at Penn State University. Dr. Kathryn Kolacz, Agronomic Soy-

bean Leader with Ceregen — a division of Monsanto — will inform the Conference participants what's "around the corner" in crop and plant biotechnology.

After lunch, Land O'Lakes Vice President and Chief Technical Officer, Dr. David Hettinga, will give the audience a view of new developments in the food product industry. The area of communication and information technology will be covered by Dr. Mark Varner, Extension Dairy Scientist at the University of Maryland and co-developer/co-moderator of Dairy-L.

Also — during the day-long, information packed program — Penn State's Dr. Harold Ott, Regional Director for Penn State Cooperative Extension, will lead a workshop on sharing ways to impact the information collected at this Conference to the clients of the participants.
