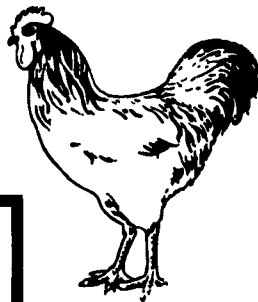

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light and unaggressive. The bulk of activity was centered around standing commitments. Seller offerings were readily available and slow to clear. Live supplies were generally moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy, but were trending lighter. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 64 to 78 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. Boneless skinless breasts were in excess. Supplies of bone-in breasts were in fairly good balance. Leg quarters and wings were at least adequate for current inquiry.

Breaking stock supplies were tight to adequate for the mixed demand, and prices were unchanged to higher. Light type hen offerings remained at least adequate for full processing schedules.
